Come Thanksgiving Day each year, many of us give the nod to Pilgrims and Indians and talk of making ready for a harsh first winter in the New World. But for the Christian, the deepest roots of our thanksgiving go back to the Old World, way back before the Pilgrims, to a story as old as creation, with a two-millennia-old climax. It's a story that keeps going right on into the present and gives meaning to our little lives, even when we're a half a globe removed from history's ground zero at a place called Golgotha. You could call it the true story of thanksgiving — or you could call it the Christian gospel viewed through the lens of that oftenundervalued virtue known as "gratitude." It opens up a few biblical texts we otherwise may be prone to downplay.

First, God created humanity for gratitude. You exist to appreciate God. He created you to honor him by giving him thanks. Appreciating both who God is and his actions for us — in creating us and sustaining our lives — is fundamental to proper human life in God's created world. As he describes in Romans 1 what's gone wrong with the world, the apostle Paul gives us this glimpse of the place of appreciation in the created order: Although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. (Romans 1:21) Part of what the first man and woman were created to do was honor God by being thankful. And part of what we exist to do is honor God by being thankful — and thus the numerous biblical commands enjoining gratitude.



Let us remember to give "Thanks" to God for all the wonderful things He has done for us. We should also remember the poor, downtrodden and those who have not yet, given their lives to God. Celebrate by the wonderful gift of giving to others to help make their lives more meaningful.

"Courage to "STAND" even in the 21st Century" Joshua 1:1-8

At some time in our lives we have all experienced fear. We've face situations that we thought were impossible and we overcame them. Our lives will always have a number of challenges; some more fearful than others, whatever fears we face, we can face them together with Jesus on our side and WITH COURAGE. Let's start here: 2Ti 1:7; For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.

To be sure God did not give us a spirit of fear. But we have it, it came packaged with the input of sin. It should, however, not cause us to wither and hide or be unbelieving and immobile.
